CHICAGO, March 9.—Numerous crop damage reports today, together with a revival of the export demand, caused a sharp reaction in wheat and May closed at an advance of 1/8 cent. Corn gained 1/4 cent and oats 1/2 cent. Pork fell off 1/2 cent and lard and ribs unchanged.

REGULARS GET EXTRA PAY. Assistant Judge Advocate General Morrison Interviewed—Commission for Two Omaha Boys.

WASHINGTON, March 9.—(Special Telegram.)
