Belling Out of the Longer on Wheat Knocked Another Cent Off on Corn.

PROVISION MARKET SLUMPS HEAVILY

Grain Fits Are Demoralized and Pork Loses 1-2 Cents, Lard 1-2 Cents and Hams 5 Cents.

CHICAGO, March 17.—Selling out of long wheat today on the hard spots knocked another cent a bushel off the price of May corn, which at the close showed a loss of 1/2 cent, while soft wheat up with an improvement of 1/2 cent.

The demoralized feeling in wheat, which was so general at the close last night, was again the prominent feature of the commencement of today's business. The early news was quite as discouraging to holders as it was the day before and the opening necessary arrangements of a revival of export demand appeared as remote as ever, notwithstanding yesterday's 20 cent decline. Live-crop started with quotations from 1 1/2 to 1 3/4 below closing prices and followed that to a further decline to 1 1/2 to 1 3/4 by 10 o'clock. Futures on Argentine shipments for the month of April were 1/2 cent lower, packing them at 2 1/2 to 3 1/4 and another 1/2 cent, both of which were considerably higher than a year ago. Chicago received only 25 cars of wheat, compared with 30 the same day last year, and only 20 cars of corn and 10 of soybeans against 25 of each. Aggregate receipts at primary western markets were 100,000 bu., compared with 100,000 bu. last year.

Atlantic port cargoes of wheat and four were quiet at the close. Receipts from stock-taking centers pointed to a small increase in the visible supply, against a fairly liberal but decreasing demand. May wheat opened 1/2 cent higher at 75c, from 72 1/2 to 73 1/2, and improved to 74c. At the night market, however, long wheat became more active and advanced 1/2 cent to 74 1/2. Short wheat was 1/2 cent lower at 65c, compared with 64 1/2 to 65 1/2.

Pressure of long holdings depressed provisions. The market did not appear to be very active, but a few sales were made. Several rallies were quickly nullified by fresh offerings of stock. May corn opened 1/2 cent lower at 37 1/2 to 38 1/2, and improved to 38 1/2 to 39 1/2. It was 1/2 cent higher at 39 1/2 to 40 1/2, and improved to 40 1/2 to 41 1/2.
