Heavy Grain Offerings from Russia Caused Chicago Market to Decline.

FEARED RAIN HAS HURT THE SPRING CROP

Corn Followed Closely the Fluctuations in Wheat—Grain Ration Firm and Higher—Provisions Active and Irregular.

CHICAGO, July 13.—Absence of demand for cash wheat and heavy grain offerings from Russia were the principal factors in the decline of 50c in wheat today. Corn and oats suffered from a general decline of 10c and 15c, respectively. Provisions advanced 10c to 25c.

Wheat opened weak and lower at 75 1/2c for September, closing at 75 1/2c. The decline was due to the arrival of heavy grain offerings from Russia. Corn followed closely the fluctuations in wheat, closing at 1.00 for September.

Oats were firm and higher early, a good cash demand sustaining prices. Local receipts were 614 cars. September receipts were 54 cars. The market advanced sharply early on a good general demand for moderate hog receipts and higher prices for hogs.

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On the produce exchange today the butter market was weak, creameries' receipts being 11,000 lbs. Eggs were steady, 12c.
