Threatened Raid on the Mellow Voices of the "Hello Girl." TELEGRAPH LINE THROUGH DARKEST AFRICA

Competition telephone service, reduced rates and relief from "hello-girl" worries are promised to Chicago within a year. Negotiations were closed recently whereby the Illinois Telephone and Telegraph company acquires for the term of its thirty-year franchise the right to operate the Strowger automatic system in Cook county.

One of the most ingenious innovations in the manufacture of storage cells is the use of granulated pumice stone with the lead from which the storage plates are moulded.

The telegraph line now building to connect the Cape of Good Hope with the Mediterranean will pass through a greater extent of wholly undeveloped country than any other line in the world.

The line is already building in the wilderness far north of the Zambesi, and at last accounts the poles were being reared and the wire strung on the plateau between Lakes Nyassa and Tanganyika.

The most responsible part of the work is in charge of Mr. Otto Berlinger who is about 30 years of age. Having advanced his surveys and preparations for the pole rearing about 220 miles beyond the point reached by the constructors, who are going ahead at the rate of two miles a day.

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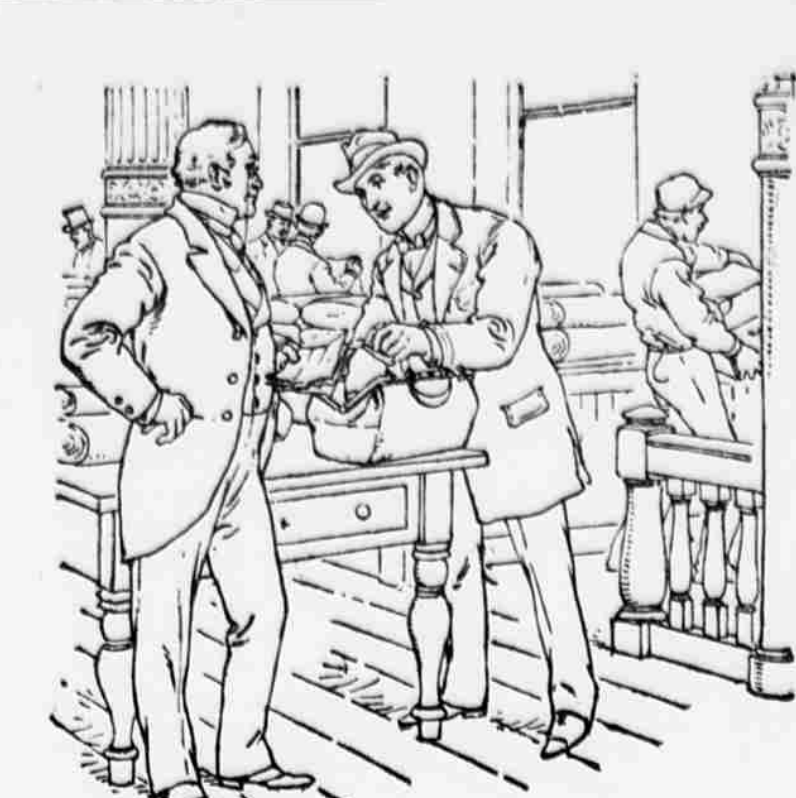
