WANTED TO COMMIT SUICIDE William Scelig Says He Does Not Like to Face the Charge of

When William Scelig and his wife, wht gave the name of Grace Nelson, were arrested on suspicion of having stolen \$174 from John King on Wednesday night they ke, up a brave front and denied any knowl-Scelig became blue and wrote a letter "To Whom it May Concern," in which he set forth that he intended to commit suicide and he hoped the finders would be good to that some day they would discover that both were innocent. Captain Donahue had a conference with him, however, and talked him out of ending his life. Scellg tore up the note, after reading it to the captain. and returned to his cell, apparently in bet-

ter spirits. While John King was taking in the "line" Wednesday night he had a drink or two with Scelig and another hackman, both of whom stand around the corner of Ninth and Douglas streets with their vehicles. with the party. All denied having seen King, but it was finally learned from the trio that the woman had been in the wine room with King and that he had paid some money from the sack which contained the cash. The money was not recovered, but the police think they have a strong case against the couple, as they say they will be able to prove that Mrs. Scelig met her husband afterward and gave him the sack. He gave the second hackman \$5 to give to King in the hope that it would silence the matter.

RELIC OF EARLY DOCKETS

Bill of Exceptions Filed in District Court that Fills Ten Big Volumes.

Among the filings in district court yesterlay was a bill of exceptions in the ancient Creedon-Patrick case, which is probably the most bulky document that has ever been filed in this district. The record of the case fills ten immense volumes and the supreme court would have to put in full time during several terms to read it. The case is one of the oldest pieces of un-

settled litigation on the district court dockets and it dates back to docket No. 18, which was filled and filed away in the vaults fully a dozen years ago. It arose in connection with the erection of the handsome residence of the Patrick family at Happy Holfow and involves about \$25,000. Creedon was the contractor who built the residence, and since then be has been endeavoring to collect the balance that he asserts is due on the job. The case was fought up 19 supreme court, then remanded and now, after another long journey through the lower courts it will once more come before the higher tribunal.
