

MUST WAIT FOR MANDATE

State Board of Transportation Given Orders in the Yeiser Telephone Case.

RESTRAINED FROM HEARING ARGUMENTS

Order is Issued on the Application of W. W. Morsman, Attorney for the Company-News of the State Capital.

LINCOLN, Oct. 17.—(Special.)—The supreme court this afternoon issued an order restraining the secretary of the State Board of Transportation from hearing arguments or testimony on the complaint of John O. Yeiser of Omaha against the Nebraska Telephone company until after a mandate is issued.

The application of W. W. Morsman recited the history of the case of the Nebraska Telephone company against the state and how it originated from the complaint of John O. Yeiser, who sought to have the Board of Transportation reduce telephone rates.

A few days after the death of the case was handed down by the supreme court the state officials comprising the Board of Transportation met and directed the secretaries to go ahead with the hearing on Yeiser's complaint.

After the restraining order was granted the afternoon Morsman said he would file his motion with the clerk of the court within a few days.

The supreme court this afternoon granted Charles L. Bugbee of this city permission to file an application for a writ of mandamus requiring Judge Holmes of the supreme court to issue a writ of mandamus to the receiver of the defunct Lincoln National bank.

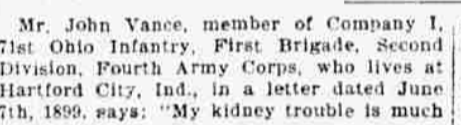

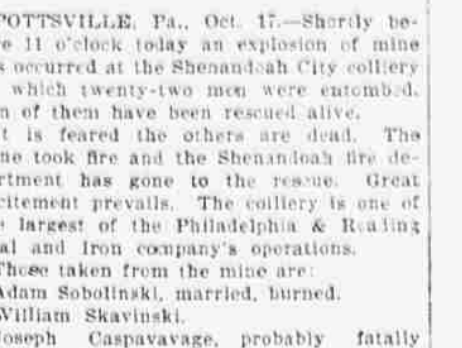
