

IDENTIFICATION WORTHLESS

Mrs. Bachelder's Sudden Renewal of Memory on Seeing the Suspects.

WAS ONCE UNABLE TO DESCRIBE THEM

Falling Recollections Revived and Given All Necessary Completeness by County Attorney and Assistant—Shields' Promises.

When Chief White took the stand again yesterday in the hearing of the two men charged with the theft of Shukert's furs he effectively dispelled the idea which the prosecution had tried the day before to convey to the jury...
