Twenty Years for Murder.

CHICAGO, Oct. 24.—Herman Hundhausen of Herman, Mo., who has been on trial for complicity in the murder of Walter F. Koeller. September 2. was sentenced today to twenty years in the penitentiary. Hundhausen and Richard Huneck, his partner in the crime, went to Koeller's room, where the latter was sick in bed, and stabbed Koeller to death.

During the trial Hundhausen declared he did not know Honeck intended to kill Koeller. After it was done, however, he concluded to stay with Honeck and take half of the blame. In his cell today Honeck asserted that Hundhausen's story was true.

"I never told a living soul what I intended to do," said Honeck. "Hundhausen is innocent so far as a previous knowledge of the
