ON HYPNOTISM AND CRIME. One Correspondent Who Declares There is No Such Thing as Hypnotic Influence.

OMAHA, Dec. 10.—To the Editor of The Bee: Crime, in the form of murder, is again attempting to unload its burden upon hypnotism.

The claim of "hypnotic influence" set up by persons who are ignorant of the subject is an excuse for the commission of crimes, because they think it offers an easy means of escape from punishment, simply because they make it. There is not today on record an authentic case in which it was proven that a moral, upright man or woman had been induced to commit a criminal or an immoral act while under "hypnotic influence."

Investigation by prominent workers in psychical research in the United States and in other countries, of crime after crime, has shown that the subject participated in while under "hypnotic influence" has shown all of them to be common, every-day crimes devoid of any "hypnotic element" whatever.

No person possesses any "hypnotic power" over another at all times, even when a hypnotist's subject is in the somnambulic state, during which the subject may either walk or talk, or do both. The subject is not a machine, or an automaton, as is commonly supposed, and suggestions made to him during hypnosis are entirely contrary to his settled rules of conduct, or that are repugnant to his moral sense, will be rejected immediately and energetically. The "power" that is so commonly believed the hypnotist exercises over the subject, is not a power, and merely such as the subject allows the hypnotist to have. The subject absolutely cannot be made to do anything against his will.

Given a criminal subject a criminal hypnotist might be able to induce him to commit a crime—not on account of any "evil power" possessed by him over his subject, but simply by reason of that subject's moral obliquity and "bent" toward wrong doing. But, as such a subject would not be content to participate in such evil suggestions while awake it is quite clear that there would not be any object in resorting to hypnotism for that purpose.

Thomson Jay Hudson, LL.D., of Washington, D. C., author of "The Law of Psychic Phenomena," and the foremost writer upon this subject in the United States, in an article that appeared in Suggestive Therapeutics, Chicago, some time ago, says:

Indeed, so persistently has this question (hypnotism and crime) been discussed, and so ably has it been obscured by the newspaper press, that the public has come to look down upon the belief that two monstrous entities have recently sprung into existence, formed a compact, and are engaged in a diabolical business under the firm name of "Hypnotism & Crime." I should not attempt to dissuade the public mind of the favorite idea, but will content myself in pointing out to the professional reader the price of the suggestion category of offenses against the peace and dignity of the state.

I do not undertake to say that auto-suggestions arising from the sources named (religion and personal dignity) would afford us protection against the suggestion of a criminal hypnotist. I merely say that they always afford some amount of protection in the absence of conscience. That such constitutes a powerful bulwark against the assaults of a criminal hypnotist is most unobscurely affirmed. They are constantly alert, jointly and severally, for the protection of the individual, the safety of self-preservation, in the absence of which the suggestion of a criminal hypnotist is a factor. But when a man has risen in the scale of humanity to the dignity of being in possession of the moral sense, which "imperatively commands and obligates him to do the right and abstain from the wrong," he is not to be induced within a circle that no power of criminal suggestion can prevail against.

The simple rule that two opposing suggestions are presented to the subjective mind of a hypnotized subject, the stronger suggestion must prevail. This is a rule that admits of no variation or exception, and follows that, when the plea is offered in a court of justice, in extension of a criminal or an immoral act that the subject was coerced by the suggestion, it amounts to a general confession that his hypnotist was a criminal, and that all other considerations combined; and it amounts to a specific proclamation of the fact that the alleged victim offered no aid of conscientious scruples regarding the particular crime which he has committed.

The ignorance of the public, generally, regarding hypnotism is due, almost wholly, to public entertainments given by fakirs who, in the majority of cases, know not all of the laws upon which it is based. Those of them who are well versed in it know that it is to their pecuniary advantage to keep it wrapped up in mystery; that the more awe-inspiring, mysterious and supernatural they can make their alleged "power" over their fellow-mortals appear, the greater will be their financial harvest. So that the people have become greatly prejudiced against hypnotism. The fact that it is suppressed and then these absurd plans of "hypnotic power" as an excuse for crime will cease to be made.

I venture to assert that some of the persons concerned in the above-mentioned case has any knowledge whatever of hypnotism and that developments will show conclusively that there was not an iota of "hypnotic power" in it. R. A. SMITH.
