### STAMPS ARE UNNECESSARY Treasury Department Passes Upon Form of Assignment Used by City Employes.

Acting under instruction from Special Internal Revenue Agent Wheelock the city comptroller has for a week or more refused to accept assignments of wages due city employes unless said assignment hore a special revenue stamp. For some time there was a doubt in the minds of officials as to the necessity for the stamp and the form of assignment used was submitted to the Treasury department by Collector H. Houtz. He received a ruling to the effect that the stamp was not required, but that did not change the orders issued by Agent Wheelock to the comptroller, and he still refused to receive the unstamped assignments.

Yesterday, however, L. Heller presented to the comptroller a letter from Collector Houtz giving the ruling of the department and the comptroller no longer requires stamps. Special Agent Wheelock is out of town, but it is said by people connected with the collector's office that he is not satisfied with the ruling and will bring the matter before the Treasury department again. Meantime the city employes can borrow money without using a stamp.
