

DODDRIDGE MAY BE CHOSEN

Belief that He Will Be Selected as President of the Gulf Line.

ELECTION EXPECTED IN THE NEAR FUTURE

Local Interest in Mr. Doddridge's Movements Because of His Long Service with the Union Pacific and Missouri Pacific.

In railroad circles it is generally expected that the election of a president of the Kansas City, Pittsburg & Gulf road will occur immediately after the sale of the property, which takes place at Joplin Monday.

In connection with the presidency of the reorganized Gulf line peculiar interest is taken in local railroad circles for the reason that two men have been prominently identified with railroads operating into this city are mentioned for the important position.

Relative to the presidency of the Gulf system the report was current a few weeks ago that General Manager Brown of the Chicago, Burlington & Quincy had been offered the position, but refused it.

The prominent position Mr. Doddridge has occupied in the railroad world for the past few weeks and at the present time is of more than ordinary interest in Omaha because of the fact that he is an old-time Union Pacific official.

Because of changes in the Union Pacific management in 1884 Mr. Doddridge temporarily discontinued railroading, but two years later re-entered the business as superintendent of the Central branch of the Union Pacific at Atchison.

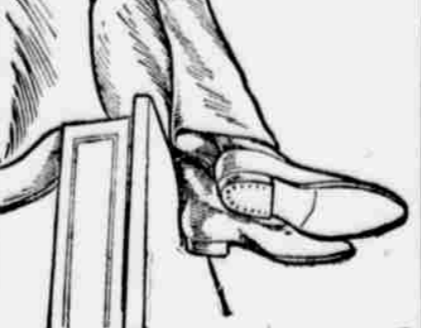
