


Strawberries are comine in more freely and a few cases of Louisiana and Texas berries were received last week. Texas berries sold for \$7 per 24-quart case and Louisiana berries at \$4.50 per 24-out case. Considerably lower prices, however, are tooked for in the next few days. Oranges are quoted about the same as they were at last report, but indications are favorable for higher prices in the near future. The same is true of lemons. The egg market, as will be noted from quotations given in another column, are a little higher than they were a week aga. Receipts are quite liberal, but at the same time the demand is heavy enough to put


