Pointer No. 4—We had another new class in Gregg shorthand last week; one of the students was an old Pitmanic writer, but after carefully investigating the Gregg he was converted to it; we will have another new class tomorrow morning, four students aiready having made their arrangements to begin; others will come in during the week. This makes fifteen new classes since January 2.

Pointer No. 5—We had seven calls last week for teachers of Gregg Shorthand; they came from all directions; never before have shorthand schools been so deeply interested in a new system as in the Gregg. It is being adopted right and left. The Omaha Commercial College will be unable to supply the teachers called for between now and September 1. Several students have concluded to make special preparation to teach Gregg shorthand, and are already hard at work.
