SAVIDGE IS NOT SUSTAINED

Committee of Inquiry Finds Omaha Divine Not Justified in Criticizing Dr. Meinturf.

The difficulty between Rev. Charles W. Savidge of Omaha and Rev. Dr. Meinturf of Spokane is aired in full in the Chronicle of the latter city and the report given out by the committee finds in favor of the Washington divine in every particular.

The committee which made inquiry into the misunderstanding was made up of J. P. Whittemore and E. P. Deright, delegates from Omaha; W. E. Piper, pastor of Nelson, B. C. Mrs. Anna Cole, deacon of the Spokane church; Henry S. Woods, treasurer; J. S. Taylor, general missionary superintendent, and W. Hendricks. The committee decided that Mr. Savidge's complaints were entirely groundless and that in all his dealings Dr. Meinturf has acted the part of a gentleman and a Christian.

Mr. Savidge's first allegation was that Dr. Meinturf desired to borrow money from the Omaha congregation to meet his April payment at Spokane. The committee found that he was justified in this expectation in view of an implied promise made by Rev. Savidge. The second complaint was based on a successful effort on the part of April to borrow \$500 from a Mrs. Michie of this city.

In view of the report the deacons of the Omaha church have decided that Mr. Savidge was not justified in his complaint and the congregation will probably concur in this view.
