The chief activity and most at-tention, however, are still concentrated on the price situation and efforts to readjust quotations to meet current demand and supply ofders go forward steadily. The ex-reption to the general downward trend of prices is that furnished in leading farm products, notably cereals, but here the mov-ing cause is hardly a notable one, being the result of less satisfactory crop reports, particularly from the northwest and from the central west, where the winter wheat yield promises to be very short and also less favorable. The northwest has had some rains, but it is claimed not enough to render the sit-uation free of danger. Corn crop conditions remain favorable, as likewise do those of oats, but these grains and hog products have sympathized in the outward move-ment.
