Pitcher Johnson, who contributed a really good exhibition of pitching, occasionally glanced back toward his managerial chief and his co-laborer, who was alleged to be in the game at second, and shot copious tears which flooded the interior of the diamond even before the clouds permitted their moisture to descend. He had reason to be disheartened.

Manager Billy Hulen and his tribe tarried on the diamond after the big crowd had passed outside. The managerial magnate called his men solemnly to one side and, though the rain fell in torrents, instructed them in the rudiments of the game. He then distributed them over the field and batted out a few parabolas and grounders. He, in turn, tried his hand at fielding for the benefit of the practice. Late in the night he issued a bulletin to the effect that his team had recovered its former brilliancy and assured anxious inquirers that he would give Daddy Rourke's Colts a run for their money in the next three games of the series.
