

Local officials of the Burlington are much interested in the large colony of Mormons which is migrating at this time into the Big Horn basin of Wyoming. This interest is particular for the reason that the Burlington is now engaged in preliminary operations for the building of an extension from Toluca, Mont., into the Big Horn basic and port the Mermon colonists will be prominent among the constituency of this new line. In speaking of the movement of 400 Mormans from Utah to the Big Horn, Amistant General Passenger Agent Arthur B. Smith of the Burlington said yesterday: "Charles Kingston, one of the leaders of this movement, is authority for the statement that the Mormons who are migrating to Wyoming are not poor people. There is not a member of the colony who has less than \$1,000 and many are worth much more. They represent the best class of Mormons. They will prove, so Mr. Kingston asserts, great colonizers. Frugal, of exemplary habits and good morals, they will in all probability convert the Big Horn basin into one of the garden spots of America. Two hundred accupies are now ready to begin work on the great irrigation ditch, which will be thirty miles long, twenty-five feet wide at the top.


