NEW STEAMER MAKES RECORD

Deutschland, of the Hamburg-American Line Establishes New Time From Plymouth.

NEW YORK, July 12.—The new express steamer Deutschland of the Hamburg-American line arrived today from Hamburg, Cherbourg and Plymouth in the record time from the latter port of five days, fifteen hours and twenty minutes, a distance of 10,644 miles at an average of 22.42 knots per hour.

This distance is six knots shorter than the distance made by the Kaiser Wilhelm Der Grosser in November, 1898, when it made its best record in five days, seventeen hours and twenty minutes, at an average speed of 22.16 knots. This is the fastest initial trip made across the Atlantic.

The first trip by the Kaiser Wilhelm Der Grosser was made in five days, twenty-two hours and thirty-five minutes over a distance of 10,600 miles.

Census Schedules Improperly Filled Out by the Enumerators.

WORK HAS BEEN DELAYED A MONTH

First Consignment of Population Reports Forwarded Yesterday—Special Census Work Begins Next Week.

All the population schedules of the Omaha census will be sent to Washington this week, the first consignment having been forwarded yesterday.

The report of the supervisor in Iowa delayed nearly a month by the errors of the enumerators, which have occasioned the handling of the sheets referring to the city population at
