SPELLBINDER IN THE TOILS

Police Arrest J. D. Rice, an itinerant curbstone Orator and Advocate of Popocracy.

J. D. Rice, who wears his hair in a Psyche twist and devotes his evenings to pulpit oratory, was fined \$1 and costs in police court yesterday for being drunk. He admitted the soft impeachment and took his medicine without a murmur and as becomes a martyr.

Rice is one of the most picturesque of the genus spellbinder. For years he and his wife—a hardworking little woman, with tears in her voice and a persuasive manner—have been "doing" the cities of the middle west and, it is said, they seldom take in less than \$50 a week. Their scheme is to hold so-called religious meetings on the street corners. By this plan they evade the license ordinance, as well as the law making begging a misdemeanor. But their harangue has in it a scarcely perceptible tinge of theology, being devoted principally to a hysterical discussion of politics, with Bryan as the keynote.

Thursday evening the woman held a mixed crowd for several hours at Sixteenth and Douglas streets. After touching upon several subjects, ranging from transcendentalism to grip, she took a hard look at her about her trunk. She had to pawn it, she said, in order to get money enough to save the children from starving. It would cost \$7.50; would the good people chip in liberally in order to enable her to get it out? They would. The hat was passed, and, after counting out the money, coin by coin, she announced that the proceeds were \$7.80. She was sure that a kind providence would reward them.

Then the male spellbinder closed the meeting with prayer, and since then he has not been seen in Omaha, as he proceeded to take on a jag and to get himself in jail.
