

OMAHA GETS SOME REVENGE

Misourians Given a Good Old Fashioned Walloping for a Farewell.

MAUPIN POUNDED INTO A JUICY PULP

Batters of the Honkbe Tribe Make the McKibben Pet Look Like a Very Bad Third-Cent-Piece.

Maybe it wasn't a great day for the roster yesterday at the Vinton Street park, but the probabilities are that it was. The roster who had the seaweedy taste in his mouth from the previous day's chagrin to keep him away yesterday has a kick coming and with no less a personage than himself as the kicker. A Misourian of the name of Maupin ambled around the St. Joe slab, looking very much like a 30-cent piece, while the fourth-placers pulled the willow on him for all kinds of single, two-baggers and home runs. Newmeyer, on the contrary, sped his work with the best of results, for while he was touched for eight hits, they were widely scattered and netted little to the good. It was Joe's turn to kick against Empire Warrier and they did it once or twice quite lustily, with the usual effect. The umpiring was in marked contrast to that which had marked the two preceding games and there was little if any ground for complaint.

Two Features of the Game.

The feature of the game was Lauson's home run hit, bringing in four runs. Another feature was Bub Wilson's error, which was split by a foul tip from Hendley's bat in the fifth inning, which put him out of the game and sent Lauson behind the bat, while Thompson stepped into right field in time to do some good stick work. Both drew blanks in the first, and in the second, after Grimm had swung out to left, Schrahl planted a long one right for three bases. Then Baer thrust one down to Rourke, which the latter was so long in corraling that Schrahl loped home, although Baer was out at first and Rourke followed suit.

Lauson singled to center and O'Connell bunted him to second, dying at first. He went home on Baird's single and the latter landed on second in the play. Hoy got a base on balls and when Wilson hit to Hendley that worthy threw wide to first and Baird went home. Hoy being caught at third and Newmeyer retiring the side with a short fly to Strang.

O'Connell gripped the ash with a vice-like fervor and hoisted another out among the forest monarchs, and also loped lazily around the ring. Baird sent a hot one down to Strang, who threw ten feet over first, and Baird wound up on third. Hoy singled, scoring Baird, and Wilson followed suit. Newman sacrificed, being the ninth man to bat, and the first man out. Hoy scored on Tomah's long fly to left and O'Rourke put a stop to the nightmare by dying at first.

In the fifth Thompson signaled his entrance into the game by trespassing upon the right field fence for two bases, and scored on Newmeyer's only single. The sixth inning threatened for a time to be an imitation of the quadrangular gavotte in the third. After O'Rourke had died at first, McKiver hit to center for two bases, Lauson singled, sending Mattie to third. Then Lauson flicked second, but when O'Connell pitched a little one out to Hendley McKiver was caught at the plate. After O'Connell had stolen second Baird plugged it for two, scoring Lauson and O'Connell, and peeling the paint from the "hit me for a box of cigars" sign. Then Hoy got it to the fence for two in his zeal to rival the home run record, but stopped at second. Baird coming home, Thompson's single scored Hoy and Newmeyer retired the side. That ended Omaha's sprinting for the game.

Saints Give It Up. Of course, after all these announcements Mr. Maupin was merely representing and his associates were about as ambitious. In the seventh hit by Schrahl coupled up with error by O'Rourke and Newmeyer and a feller's choice by Baer for another run, hit in the eighth a base on balls and a two-bagger by Flynn scored Strang.
