

CATHOLICS BUILD CHURCHES

Work Under Way Will Amount to Over One Hundred Thousand Dollars.

PLANS FOR ST. CECILIA'S NEARLY READY

Construction of Sacred Heart Church Well Under Way—Talk of a Cathedral in the Air.

The value of the churches, schools and hospitals of the Roman Catholic church in Omaha and South Omaha, now in course of construction, or to be begun this year, exceeds \$100,000, exclusive of the value of the real estate. These buildings include the chapel at St. Joseph's hospital, \$15,000; Sacred Heart church, \$25,000; St. Cecilia's church, \$20,000, and House of the Good Shepherd, \$45,000.

STRONGEST IN THE WORLD

Building a cathedral is a work of years, and while plans may be discussed at this time, it may be ten years before any practical steps are taken looking to the construction of the edifice.

LOOKING UP FIRE ESCAPES

Several Structures Found to Be Poorly Equipped with These Appliances.

MATTER MUST BE REMEDIED AT ONCE

Lodges to Be Forbidden to Hold Meetings in Blocks that Are Insufficiently Provided with Means of Egress.

Acting under the instructions of the State Bureau of Labor and Industrial Statistics, R. B. Carter, city inspector of buildings, has been examining fire escapes in Omaha and has found several structures that are very poorly equipped.

Some time ago the owners of the Continental block, located at the northeast corner of Fifteenth and Douglas streets, removed a portion of the fire escape on the south front of the building for the purpose of making changes in the windows.

Complaints have been made concerning inadequate escapes on the Arlington block, but Mr. Carter examined the building and found it in a satisfactory condition.

For several days past the inhabitants of the little town of Bennington have been considerably excited over the mysterious disappearance of Mrs. C. J. Warner and her children and servant girl. The last seen of them until yesterday, when the girl was found at the home of her parents about four miles out of town, was last Saturday night. At that time Warren came home, it is said, in an intoxicated condition and drove the family out of doors, threatening in the meantime to resort to violence unless his commands were complied with. Although the neighbors heard the threats he made, none of them interfered.

The servant girl who accompanied Mrs. Warner and the children says that they are safe and that they have gone into the country. She refuses to reveal their whereabouts.
