Several Structures Found to Be Poorly Equipped with These Appliances.

MATTER MUST BE REMEDIED AT ONCE

Lodges to Be Forbidden to Hold Meetings in Blocks that Are Insufficiently Provided with Means of Egress.

### Street Concerns aged by Fire.

About 2 o'clock yesterday a gasoline stove exploded in the rear of Joseph Munch's tailor shop at 1709 Leavenworth street. The flames were quickly communicated to the rear walls and by the time the hose company arrived the fire was burning on three floors. A call brought out the entire department on the south side and for a few moments it looked as though the block was to be destroyed. Five streams of water were turned on and the flames were controlled after they had practically destroyed the rear of 1709 and 1711.

The upper rooms are occupied as living apartments by several families. The loss at Kealer's, at the barber shop and at Stickney's was caused by water. The tailor shop is a total loss. 




