POISON IN FARM PRODUCTS

Drugs Are Poured Into Milk Before it Has Lost Animal Heat.

PURE COUNTRY BUTTER THING OF THE PAST

Farmers Are Obliged to Adulterate Their Products Before They Will Be Accepted by Creameries Serving City Trade.

"There is considerable fiction about pure country butter, rich, yellow country crean and unadulterated country milk. While visiting a farm house about twenty mile west of Omaha last week I noticed bottles of milk preservative and butter coloring on a shelf in the kitchen. Both the bottles were labeled in plain letters. I immediately asked what use was made of them and was told that creameries will not buy milk that does not contain enough preserva-

cach gallon of milk," the commissioner continued. "The farmer's wife then told me It is hoped that 500 Omaha people will farmers explains much of our trouble with felt this year in a way that is promoting

the farm house I supposed that our milk than ever before. was adulterated by the dealers and had no idea that drugs are poured into milk before it has lost the animal heat. The farmers do not seem to realize that they are violating the law in the use of preservatives and many of them will quit the practice when their attention is called to the heavy penalty that attaches to such an offense.

Public Will Be Informed. "The city milk inspector is securing samples of the products of different dairies each day now and we are making a daily report which is open to the inspection of the public. Milk from all the dairies in the city will be tested at least once a month and if we cannot punish the dishonest dealers we can at least give the public a chance to come to the city ball and learn what sort of milk dairymen are supplying.

"The milk dealers who were convicted of using preservatives, M. Rasmussen, J. C. Root, Paulsen Bros., and the Waterloo creamery, are continuing their business in violation of the city milk ordinance. Section 13 of this ordinance reads as follows: 'Any conviction of a violation of any provision of of any license or certificate issued here-

"Under this ordinance persons found guilty of using drugs do not escape with a DAYLIGHT TRAINS FOR SPIRIT LAKE, small fine, but forfeit their license, and a strict enforcement of this provision will discourage the wholesale adulteration that has been practiced in Omaha. It is the intention of the health department to exert the greatest care in examining the milk sold by all dealers and violators of the ordinance will be prosecuted. Bids for city fuel and forage were opened by the Board of Public Works Wednesday afternoon. J. J. Tawney & Son were the only bidders on forage and the contract was awarded to them at the following prices: Baled hay, \$7.70 per ton; baled straw, \$6.45 per ton; bran, \$14.45 per ton; white oats, 29% cents per bushel; yellow corn, 38% cents per bushel. The South Omaha and Coal company, Victor White, Coal Hill Coal company, Omaha Coal, Coke and Lime company and the Nebraska Fuel company submitted bids on fuel, but there was such a variety in the coal that the board will not award the contracts until making further investigation of the samples submitted. The price offered on 1,500 tons of steam coal ranged from \$2 to \$3.50 per ton and there was the same variation in the prices of different kinds of coal to be purchased in smaller quantities.
