FORT DODGE, In., Sept. 19 .- (Special Telegram :- Amatour bank robbers have reated great excitement in the village of lare, fourteen miles northwest of here, by ttempting to rob the State Bank of Clare. They secured an entrance to the bank last night and sought to blow open the vault by punching out rivers in the dial on the vault door. The crevices were filled with powerful explosives and touched off. The result evidently surprised the robbers as much as the people of Clare.

The dial and a portion of the vault door were blown through the front window of the bank and across a seventy-foot street and through the window of the hotel. The noise awakened every one in town and the frightened robbers made good their escape, but without a penny of the expected pooty.
