Wheat Opens Weak, Turns Strong and Closes Somewhat Higher.

QUIET CORN MARKET FOLLOWS WHEAT LEAD.

Oats Are Generally Neglected and Finish Session Slightly Advanced.

→Provisions Lack Life, Lard Showing Much Weakness.

CHICAGO, Sept. 21.—After a weak beginning today wheat turned strong and October closed No 2 over yesterday. Corn closed 5¢ higher and oats 5¢ higher. Provisions closed 10¢ lower.

With Liverpool only 10¢ lower, in the face of the stamp here yesterday, there was some buying of wheat when the market opened. October at 76¢ 73¢. The steaming was short-lived, however, for heavy amounts were for sale, under the influence of clear and cool weather in the northwest. The stuff bought early was unloading with a rapidity that would have been surprising had it been offered at 76¢ 73¢.

A good shipping demand here made its appearance. Commission houses had heavy buying orders, which has been waiting for the market to get under 76¢. Northwestern markets easily turned strong and damage reports from the spring wheat were numerous and very gloomy. Estimates of the harvest were made and a report of 200,000 bushels less than in the world crop of 2,000,000 bushels. Losses, however, from these considerations, found wheat hard to get and a sharp fall followed.

Corn was weak early, strong later and at all times quiet. The weakness early was with the understanding that the market from the selling of shorts. Offerings were light and sharp rally took place, the buying being at 76¢ 73¢. October closed 5¢ 2¢ higher and closed 5¢ over higher.
