At its meeting yesterday the Board of County Commissioners adopted a resolution directing the county attorney to draft a proclamation for submitting to the voters in the coming election a bond proposition.

The proposition to vote bonds for the proposed electric interurban railway did not come up, although a protest was read against it specifically bearing the signatures of Herman Kuntze, P. H.
