Amendments to the Constitution to Be Submitted This Fall. County Auditor Innes received yesterday from the secretary of state a certified copy of the proposed amendment to the constiutton providing for bleanial elections, which is to be balloted on at the general election next month. It reads as follows:

Shall the following amendment to the constitution be adopted? Add as section to to article xil of the constitution the following: "Section 16. The first general election after the adoption of this amendment shall be held on the Tuesday next after the first monday in November in the year one thousand nine hundred and two, and general elections shall be held blannually thereafter. In the year one thousand nine hundred and two there shall be elected a governor, secretary of

In the year one thousand nine hundred and two there shall be elected a governor, lieutenant governor, secretary of state, auditor of state, treasurer of state, attorney general, two judges of the supreme court, the successors of the judges of the district court whose terms of office expire December 31, one thousand nine hundred and two; state senators who would otherwise be chosen in the year one thousand nine hundred and one, and members of the house of representatives. 
