ORDNANCE BUREAU REPORTS

Most Interesting Portion of Document Not Made Public. DISCUSSES SOME TECHNICAL SUBJECTS

Progress Made in Modernizing the Artillery Equipment of the Country—Stop Work on Field Guns.

WASHINGTON, Nov. 15.—The report of General Bullington, chief of the Bureau of Ordnance, has been made to the secretary of war. As some of the most interesting portions of the report, dealing with disputed points between the Ordnance bureau and the Board of Ordnance and Fortifications, are contained in appendices, which have not yet been made public, the report is not as interesting as expected.

Another controversy is that relating to the disappearing gun carriage, whose further manufacture has been stopped against the Board of Ordnance and Fortifications. General Bullington discusses the history of this carriage, showing that it was ordered by the Endicott board and the secretary of war.

It was, therefore, presented to the Ordnance department as a problem to be solved and the present service carriage is the best solution of it. It is able to find its way through the most difficult terrain.

NAVY BUYS ARMOR PLATE

Government Lets \$16,000,000 Contract to Carnegie and Bethlehem Companies.

WASHINGTON, Nov. 15.—Secretary Long today announced the conclusion of the long controversy over the price of armor plate for naval vessels and an agreement with the Carnegie and Bethlehem companies for Krupp armor at \$420 a ton, with the possible addition of royalties fees, making the maximum price \$455.25 a ton.

The following official statement was given out concerning the agreement: The Navy department has come to an agreement with the Carnegie and Bethlehem companies for Krupp armor of the first class amounting to 3,500 tons for \$1,470,000.

The armor contract covers not only the 24,500 tons specified in the official statement, but also some 10,000 tons of armor which have given out during the war.

EXECUTORS ARE RESTRAINED

Philadelphia Woman Seizes Injunction Against Trustees of Will of Late W. L. Stong.

NEW YORK, Nov. 15.—Judge Lacombe of the United States circuit court today, on the application of Eliza T. Griswold of Philadelphia, granted the temporary injunction sought by Miss W. L. Stong, P. Bradley Strong and Albert R. Shattuck, individually and as executors and trustees of the will of the late William L. Stong, which restrains them from parting with or disposing of certain real estate, stocks and other securities claimed by the complainants.

The bill of complaint states that prior to November 2, 1900, the complainant entrusted to the late William L. Stong certain moneys, approximately amounting to \$125,000, for the sole purpose of investing the same for her benefit and account; that Mr. Stong advised her from time to time that such investments were made in good and sufficient mortgages, bonds and stocks and other securities.

The papers also assert that on the death of Mr. Stong the defendants took possession of his estate, including the property owned by the complainant, which, on the 12th of November they refused to deliver to the petitioner, and therefore asked that the three defendants or their agents be restrained from selling, delivering or parting with the property mentioned.

WASHINGTON, Nov. 15.—News was received here today of the death from typhoid fever of Mrs. McKinley's nephew, Assistant Paymaster J. S. Barber, at Hong Kong. The news came in the form of a dispatch to the Navy department from the commander of the Monterey, to which young Barber was attached. News of the death was conveyed to the White House personally by Captain Crowles, acting chief of the navigation bureau, and caused great grief to Mrs. McKinley and the president.

COTTON MEN PETITION HAY

MORE DONS THAN YANKEES

Cuban Immigration Statistics Show Returning Spaniards to Greatly Outnumber Americans.

WASHINGTON, Nov. 15.—According to a statement from the division of customs and insular affairs of the War department, the total number of immigrants arriving at New York during the month of October was 21,167, of which 1,288 came from the United States, 17,988 from Spain, 881 from Mexico and 981 from other countries.
