

TWO OF THEIR PROSECUTIONS FAIL

The game of bluff which the fusionists attempted to play during the days immediately preceding election was made painfully apparent in Justice Baldwin's court yesterday, when Councilman Harry B. after a brief hearing. It will be remembered that the howls of the fusionists in the ante-election days about colonization and fraudulent registrations were so dolorous that they were positively painful. The local organ of the democracy took up the wall and lashed itself into fit after fit of pretended indignaton as it printed double-leaded stories over the republican colonization in the Third ward. It even went so far during one of these spasms as to offer a cash reward for evidence that would convict anyone of having registered illegally.
