FAST MAIL BREAKS RECORD.

Engineer Johnson Out of Regular Schedule. MAKES 154 MILES IN 150 MINUTES.

Leaves Grand Island Almost Two Hours Late and Arrives at Council Bluffs Twenty-seven Minutes Behind Time.

Engineer Adam Johnson and Conductor M. C. Wallace of the Union Pacific accomplished a run with the Fast Mail from Grand Island into Omaha Thursday afternoon.

When the Fast Mail reached Grand Island from the west Thursday afternoon it was nearly two hours late, and Johnson knew that he would have to cut a few kinks out of his regular schedule into Omaha in order to permit the Fast Mail to connect with the eastbound trains from Omaha.

Johnson, however, knew the capabilities of No. 32, and he was confident that he could reduce the tardiness of the Fast Mail. As soon as No. 102 got into Grand Island Johnson's engine was attached to the train, and when the yard limits were passed the engine responded to the touch of his master and bounded over the rails with a lightning speed.

Leaving Grand Island the Fast Mail was exactly one hour and forty-seven minutes late, but Johnson was not daunted and determined to get his train into Omaha as near its scheduled time of arrival as possible.

The first stop was at Columbus and the sixty-two miles intervening were covered in exactly one hour—more than a mile a minute. From Columbus to Fremont the speed was slackened a bit, although at the rate of travel it was necessary to be in the air and the mail clerks busy at work in their cars passed in wonderment. The run to Fremont—forty-four miles—consumed forty-six minutes. Johnson had held in reserve the best speed of his engine for the home stretch, and it fair to say between Fremont and Omaha. Through the open country the train attained a speed that made a mile a minute look like a freight train schedule. The customary stop was made at South Omaha and slackened speed was necessary for the run to Omaha into Omaha, but even at that the distance of forty-six miles between Fremont and Omaha was made in forty-six minutes.

The Fast Mail was delivered at the Council Bluffs transfer just twenty-seven minutes late. One hour and forty minutes had been made up from Grand Island into Omaha, and the entire distance of 154 miles was made in 150 minutes.</
