Omaha Educators Will Be Well Represented at Lincoln Meeting.

NUMBER OF EMINENT SPEAKERS PRESENT

Program is Mostly Filled, However, by Nebraskaans Who Are Specialists in Their Lines of Work.

Omaha and South Omaha teachers will be well represented on the program of the thirty-fifth annual meeting of the Nebraska State Teachers' association, held at Lincoln December 26, 27 and 28.

Dr. H. A. Senter of Omaha will report to the Physical Science section on experiments and supplies for laboratories, and Miss Eva O'Sullivan of South Omaha will discuss the question, "Should Laboratory and Text Book Work Begin Simultaneously?"

Dr. S. R. Towne of Omaha will address the physical culture teachers concerning the hygiene inspection of schools and pupils and Miss Helen Woodman of Omaha will read a paper on "The Place of Recreative Work in Physical Culture for Children."

More than 200 names appear on the program of the association and all are Nebraska men and women with five or six exceptions.

Members of the Nebraska library section are particularly interested in an address which Johnson Brigham, the Iowa state librarian, will deliver on "What a Library Commission Can Do for Nebraska."
