Prices this week have been strong and, on the whole, advanced, while the activity was considerable. The chief qualification that can be observed in the speculative situation is that the public is not in the market. Large interests support their specialties and evince confidence in the future of prices and the manipulation of different securities has the support of the traders and the professional element generally. Commission house business has been slow and the chief feature, so far as the outside participation is concerned, is the steady investment buying of bonds and dividend-paying stocks. This process continues to absorb large amounts of railroad securities of the better class and to take them out of the market, while it is also observed that there has been no selling pressure.

The continued case of money has been a factor in this connection, there having been but slight appearances of hardening of rates over April 1, and the fact that on Friday some \$15.00.00 was disbursed in the dividends on various stocks created no previous disturbance of loans. Some little hardening of time loan rates was observed, but the developments in this connection were not sufficient to encourage bearish feelings in the face of the excellent railroad earnings, the more or less favorable cropoutlook and the activity of the iron and steel trade.
