Omahans who are interested in its welfare will read the following statistics with considerable interest: The Woodmen of the World is divided into 3 Jurisdictions, known as the Sovereign Camp, the Canadian and the Pacific; the Pacific Jurisdiction comprising all states west of and including Colorado, the Canadian Jurisdiction the Dominion of Canada, the Sovereign Camp Jurisdiction covers the remainder of the United States. The number of members in actual good standing on the first day of January in 1901 in the different Jurisdictions was as follows:

Each Jurisdiction has provided a large Reserve or Emergency Fund, that of the Sovereign Camp Jurisdiction amounting upwards to a quarter million of dollars and increasing steadily.

With eleven strong Camps in the City of Omaha and five in the City of South Omaha, with its headquarters in its own building formerly known as the Sheeley Block, giving employment to nearly one hundred and twenty five persons in the city, collecting and disbursing at the rate of two and one-half millions of dollars per annum, all of which passes through the Omaha banks, some idea of the importance to the City of Omaha may be estimated.

To the patriotic citizens of Omaha who are willing to promote home industry and home institutions this institution should appeal for their patronage and encouragement. Its accumulation of reserve fund guarantees the liquidation of every obligation—its economical management guarantees protection at the least possible cost.
