

EXPOSITION IS DEDICATED

Great Crowds Witness the Formal Ceremony at Buffalo.

VICE PRESIDENT ROOSEVELT SPEAKS

Points Out Where the Exposition Reflects the Past and Lays Foundation for Better Things in the Future.

BUFFALO, May 20.—Lowering clouds that threatened rain and a wind that blew fitful gusts marked the opening hours of dedication day at the Pan-American exposition.

The military band formed at the city hall and the streets radiating from it, and the foreign and state commissioners and distinguished visitors were received at the main entrance to the municipal building.

Senators Lodge and Hanna were early arrivals at the city hall, while Vice President Roosevelt and President Milburn did not arrive until later.

Ten Thousand Carrier Pigeons

About noon the multitude began to enter on the esplanade, about the Temple of Music, where the exercises were held.

The first of the ceremonies on the grounds was the flight of 10,000 homing pigeons.

The troops were massed on and around the Bridge of Triumph and at 12:35 o'clock the officials and special guests headed by Vice President Roosevelt and President Milburn of the exposition, marched through open ranks and on through the roped enclosure to the Temple of Music.

Prayer by Bishop Fowler

Twenty minutes later President Milburn led the speakers and special guests to the platform.

President Milburn received an ovation when he arose to speak, and it was some time before he could secure attention.

By reading the telegrams and cablegrams of a congratulatory nature received during the day, commencing with that of President McKinley which follows:

REDUCES CALLAHAN'S BOND

Judge Baker Discharges Defendant on Charges of Robbery and Larceny.

FIXES BAIL AT THREE THOUSAND

Attorney for Alleged Kidnaper Expected to Take Him Out of Jail Some Time This Week.

James Callahan may be out on bail within a few days, as two of the heaviest bonds required from him were done away with yesterday when Judge Baker announced the plea in bar for the discharge of the defendant in the robbery and larceny cases.

At 2 o'clock yesterday the attorneys for Callahan appeared in the criminal court room and moved for judgment in the robbery and larceny cases, pleading for the discharge of the defendant on the ground that he had already been put in jeopardy for the same offense as is alleged in each of these remaining cases.

This action finally disposed of all the cases against Callahan excepting the one of false imprisonment and the new case of perjury. It is understood that the county attorney will endeavor to bring the alleged kidnaper to trial on the charge of false imprisonment in the event of his failure to secure a conviction in the perjury case, which is set for preliminary hearing on May 27.

COMMISSIONERS FILE OFFSET CLAIM

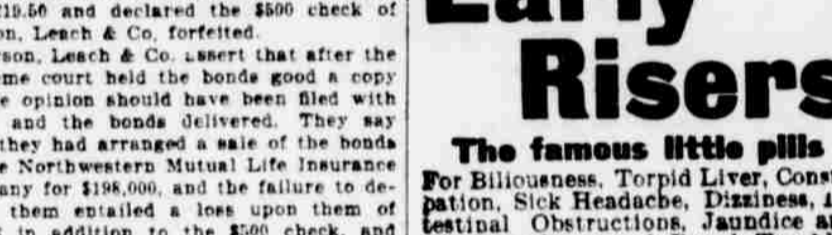
Suit Grows Out of a Misunderstanding Relative to an Issue of Douglas County Bonds.
