

Representation is pro-vided for as follows: The governor of each transmississippi state or territory may appoint ten delegates; the mayor of each city one delegate and one additional delegate for each 5,000 inhabitants, provided, however, that no city shall have more than ten delegates. Each county may appoint one delegate through its executive officer; and one additional delegate for every fifty members, provided, however, that no such organization shall have more than ten delegates. Governors of states and territories, members of the United States congress and ex-presidents of this congress are exofficio delegates, with all privileges of delegates except those of voting.
