Proliminary Examination Begins Before Judge Vinsonhaler in County Court.

SEVEN COUNTS IN THE INFORMATION

Testimony at Present Hearing Will Be Repetition of Part of the Evidence Given at Trial for Robbery.

The preliminary examination of James Callahan on the charge of perjury has begun before Judge Vinsonhaler in the county court. This is the case in which Callahan is accused of testifying falsely at the time

he was on trial for robbery. The county attorney, in an opening statement to the court, said that he expected to prove that Callahan committed perjury when he swore that he had no mustache on December 19 and for two weeks prior thereto, when he swore that he was at John Arff's saloon about an hour during the forenoon of December 19, when he swore that he was never at the Melrose Hill house in which Eddie Cudahy was held a prisoner. when he swore that he was not with Crowe at the time the pony was purchased from Daniel Burris and had never talked with when he swore that the last time he saw Pat Crowe was the latter part of November or the first of December, when he swore that he had nothing to do with the plot to kidnap Eddie Cudahy, and when he swore that he knew nothing of the kidnaping until he read of it in the news-

Lawyer Macfarland made a long statement for the defendant, in which he denied that Callahan had willfully committed perjury at any stage of the trial for robbery. H. B. Boyles, court reporter for Judge Baker, was the first witness called. He identified the transcript of the evidence On and given by Callahan in the district court, in order that it might be introduced in evidence in the perjury case.

The testimony to be taken in the present examination will be practically the same as that given at the robbery trial, excepting that it will not be nearly so voluminous. The state will merely undertake to
