The musicians are gradually getting away from the city and ere long almost all of the studios will be closed.

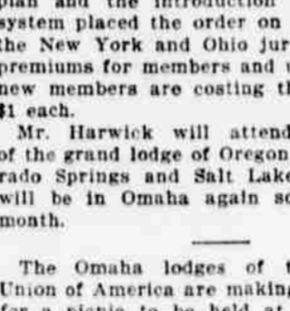
