NEWS OF RAIN CAUSES CORN TO BREAK

Downward Movement Participated in by All Grains—Wheat Closes Two Cents Lower—Oats Sales Heavy—Provisions Neglected.

CHICAGO, July 29.—With the drought broken the corn market today led a downward movement, participated in by the other grains. Wheat with a decline in the factors contributing to the weakness, closed 2 cents lower for September delivery. September wheat was at 82 1/2c, and September oats 1 1/2c higher except for hard white, which was 1/4c lower.
