Plans for Annual Holiday Are Now Well Under Way.

INDICATIONS DENOTE A BIG SUCCESS.

OMAHA, Aug. 30.-To the Citizens of Omaha: The statutes of the state of Nebraska designated the first Monday in the month of September as Labor Day.

The legislature of our state, recognizing the nobility of labor and the necessity for its proper protection, has designated this day as a holiday to be observed by the co-called laboring classes.
