After the cattle came bloodstock. Beatrice with their prize display of hogs. Several thousand people were on the grounds today. Game from Other States Unlawful.
An official opinion was given in the attorney general's office today declaring that it is unlawful for a person to bring into Nebraska during the closed game season game which has been killed in open season in any other state. It is in response to an inquiry from Chief Game Warden Snappkins.
Packers Approve Labor Law.
Labor Commissioner Watson has received the following communication from A. N. Benn of the Omaha Packing company:
"Your favor of the 30th is at hand and in reply beg to say that we will gladly cooperate with you along the lines mentioned. The Omaha public schools open up this week and the South Omaha public schools next week and we have instructed our timekeepers to see to it that no one under the age of 14 enters the school term and as far as possible between the ages of 14 and 16 is hired. Occasionally it is certainly an act of charity to give employment to children between the ages of 10 and 16, even during the school term, for various reasons. We consider the child labor law a go. one and trust that it will be enforced."

Receipts of State Treasury.
The report of Auditor Weston for the month of August shows that the receipts of the treasurer's office during that period exceeded the disbursements by \$11,929.20. The balance of money on hand July 31 was \$682,781.51, while on August 31 the amount was \$696,980.81. The uninvested balance of the permanent school fund was slightly larger on August 31 than a month earlier, but this is accounted for by the unusually large receipts. The investments of this fund during the month exceeded by \$7,000 the investments made during a corresponding period last year. Following is the detailed statement:
