ROCKHILL LEAVES WHEN DONE

Quits Pakin Day After Protocol is Signed, Reports Conger.

CITY IS BEING PUT TO RIGHTS RAPIDLY

General Kie's Troops Enter to Police It and Gangs Are Put to Work on the Streets and Palaces.

WASHINGTON, Sept. 9.—The following cablegram was received at the State department today: "PERKIN, Sept. 9.—Protocol signed September 9, 1901. 'CONGRER.' Mr. Rockhill has been trying to start home from Pekin since August 15. He was authorized to leave then by Secretary Hay, but naturally desiring to complete the important work he had undertaken in connection with the preparation of the protocol he remained until the finishing touches had been added and the document signed.

WASHINGTON, Sept. 9.—The imperial edict issued recently, providing for reform of the examinations, seems to indicate that the liberals are in control of the court, and its importance, if enforced, is difficult to overestimate. It provides that the examinations include western history, western sciences and industrial methods. It abolishes the traditional eight part classical essays and verbal reproductions of the classics, proficiency in which has been the chief qualification for office holdings. It relates the classics to the background, requiring only a general knowledge of them.

KANSAS GETS CLOUDBURST Streams Out of Their Banks and Great Damage Done to Property. KANSAS CITY, Sept. 9.—A special to the Star from Horton, Kan., says: The heaviest rain in years, amounting almost to a cloudburst, fell last night in Decatur county, a total of three inches of water falling in Oberlin, Decatur and Jennings. In Oberlin the sudden downfall flooded the town, the water standing a foot deep over the greater portion of the place, and flooding basements. In Decatur, the county abstract records and several mercantile houses sustained much damage to stock. Sapp creek was a torrent nearly a mile wide in places and swept away hay and feed, stacked on the lowlands, and washed out culverts and bridges. The damage to farms along the streams will be great. All the trains are running on slow orders. The flood exceeds the heavy rain of 1892.

LONG-LOST MAN IS FOUND St. Joseph Railroad Contractor Who Disappeared Twenty Years Ago Dies at Poor Farm. ST. JOSEPH, Sept. 9.—(Special Telegram)—Twenty years ago, Michael Stone, a prominent railroad contractor, 60 years of age, disappeared from his home in Manchester, Ia. He had a family of grown children which spent large sums of money in searching for him. He was taken up for dead many years ago. The body of Michael Stone lies on a marble slab in Sidenfaden & Foley's undertaking rooms here. He died at the poor farm yesterday, where he had been an inmate for two years. He was identified by accident today.
