TO TEST AN EXEMPTION LAW

Judge Gordon Says a Higher Court Must Pass Upon the Question of Constitutionality.

A case of considerable importance as touching the constitutionality of the exemption laws passed by the last legislature came up before Judge Gordon of the police court yesterday under the caption of the State against Meyer Green, who is charged with removing from the state property under attachment. The offense consists of an alleged violation of the law relating to exemptions.

Green's counsel maintained that the law was unconstitutional, for the reason that the title of the bill contained more than one subject, naming both a civil and a criminal liability. Judge Gordon refused to pass upon this point. He said there were higher tribunals more competent to determine it and that the case must go to trial upon its merits. If the defendant were found guilty he could have his redress in appeal. It will be tried some day next week, the exact day not having been agreed upon.
