RETURNS ASKED FOR FAVORS GIVEN

London, Oct. 11.—The Spectator tomorrow will print letters from Cecil Rhodes and the late Francis Schnadhorst, who from 1885 to 1892 was the chief organizer and advisor of the liberal party, sustaining the sensational allegations, made some months ago, that Mr. Rhodes, in 1891, gave £5,000 to the liberal party on condition that Mr. Schnadhorst would not write about the evacuation of Egypt by the British troops.

RETURNS ASKED FOR FAVORS GIVEN

London, Oct. 11.—The storm raised by General Buller's remarkable outburst yesterday afternoon continues to grow. The speech is the one topic of discussion and there is general anticipation that disquieting disclosures will follow unless General Buller himself takes the course of a conservative supporter of the government as the Standard and resigns. The tone of the press is generally one of surprised amazement at his indiscretions. The people of England have generally stuck to their guns and his and his wife's social influence has been most powerful and has even reached the court. It had been decided that he would be elevated to the peerage on the next honor list, but it is now doubtful, if, after yesterday's confession that he advised the surrender of Ladysmith, a humiliation which, "all other reverses of the war would have been trivial," neither the king nor the people will continue to favor him.

DUMONT BALLOON A SUCCESS

Has Astonishing Speed and Under Perfect Control of the Inventor.

DUMONT BALLOON A SUCCESS

New York, Oct. 11.—M. Santos-Dumont, having completed the repairs to his balloon, the Santos-Dumont VI, in spite of unfavorable predictions based on a sudden rise of the barometer, decided yesterday to start against the wind and maneuver around Longchamp race course, says the Paris correspondent of the Herald.

DUMONT BALLOON A SUCCESS

When the signal to start was given the Santos-Dumont VI shot off like an arrow, and in spite of a contrary wind reached Longchamp at a speed impossible to estimate in the actual state of aerological conditions, but certainly as fast as rapid automobile travels. The speed cannot be estimated at less than sixty kilometres an hour.

DUMONT BALLOON A SUCCESS

For more than an hour the balloon maneuvered in all directions above the racecourse with perfect docility, in the presence of numerous spectators. An enormous crowd had assembled outside the enclosure waiting for the aeronaut to venture out. The balloon reached the rendezvous in the twinkling of an eye, while the friends of the aeronaut followed it with all speed.

DUMONT BALLOON A SUCCESS

When tea was over M. Santos-Dumont returned in his aerial carriage to Longchamp, crossing the Seine at a height of about 200 metres, slightly overshoot the Arc d'Arrestation. With a sudden turn he came back to his goal, and passing with considerable speed over the telegraph wire which runs along the western side of the park stopped in a few minutes between two sheds, crossing the Seine at a height of 100 metres. It requires astonishing skill to descend in so narrow a space. At one instant it was feared that he was lost, for he passed within two metres of M. Detsch's house, which blocks the entrance to the house on the side, but he escaped danger by a bold maneuver that brought him exactly in front of his own structure, which he entered without waiting for the arrival of the workmen, who were coming up in an automobile carriage at express speed.

DUMONT BALLOON A SUCCESS

PARIS, Oct. 11.—Santos-Dumont, the Brazilian aeronaut, made another attempt today to win the Deutsch prize, but, owing to an accident to the rudder of his flying machine, he was obliged to return to the starting place after going fifty yards.
