SURPRISE TO BUSINESS MEN

Omission of Omaha Supply Depot from Indian Appropriation Bill. ASK CONGRESSMAN MERCER TO EXPLAIN Having Been Assured by Representative that Matter Would Be Cared For, Omaha Men Pay No Attention to It.

The report from Washington to the effect that the appropriation bill made no provision for maintaining the Indian supply depot at Omaha was received with considerable surprise by the members of the Commercial club and the merchants interested in the operation of the depot at this point.

The surprise was all the greater from the fact that Congressman Mercer on his last visit to the city had pledged the members of the club that the usual appropriation would not only be made, but that it would be increased to allow the government to pay the rent on the warehouse.

As soon as the report was received that the Omaha depot would be abandoned under the provisions of the bill now pending in congress the secretary of the Commercial club sent a telegram to Congressman Mercer asking him to explain the matter and to let the merchants of the city know the reason for the change.
