County Superintendent McManus of This City Has Drafted, at the Request of the Executive Committee of the State Teachers Association, a Bill Providing for the Uniformity of Examinations of Teachers, so that a certificate issued in the state, under the present system, a teacher having a certificate in one county and moving to another county to teach is required to secure a certificate from the county superintendent of the county to which she moves before she can hold a position as teacher.

The title of the bill drafted by Superintendent McManus is: "An act to regulate the examination and certification of all superintendents, supervisors, principals and teachers of the public schools of the state of Iowa."

State Board to Issue Licenses.

FATAL RESULT FROM A FALL

Former Prominent Iowa Politician Dies in Chicago as Result of Injuries.

CHICAGO, Feb. 6.—M. S. Anderson, a prominent stockman and a politician in Iowa for a number of years, is dead at his home in this city, the result of injuries received in a fall from a window at Chicago, Jan. 24, when he fell on a sidewalk.

Mr. Anderson was well known throughout the central and eastern part of the state. He formerly lived at Williamsburg, Ia., where he was known as the "Heutenant" of Capt. J. W. W. Rumble of Morgan, Ia., now congressman from that district. He has held several political offices in the state and removed to Chicago a short time ago. He was about 52 years old and was married.

TO BRACE UP FREIGHT RATES

Western Officials Will Hold Frequent Meetings for This Purpose.
