London Market is Controlled by the Bank of England.

BUSINESS ON STOCK EXCHANGE IRREGULAR

Attributed to Settlement Occupying the Attention of Speculators—Towards Close Prices Become Firmer and Trade Active.

LONDON, Feb. 12.—The demand for money was strong today. The market was entirely controlled by the Bank of England, to which there was considerable indebtedness. Discounts were inclined to be easier, being affected by continental bill buying.

Business on the stock exchange was irregular. This was attributed to the settlement occupying the attention of operators. Later prices were firmer and moderately active.
