

The president drove in an open landau with Colonel Bingham, his naval aide, Commander Cowles following in a carriage. The cheering was continuous as the president drove along and he had his slik hat off his head much of the time in recognition of the repeated In going to the other end of the capitol demonstrations.

As the president stepped out of the carriage the German ambassador was at the threshold to greet him. There was a momentary exchange of greeting and then the president passed up the stairway to the drawing room, where Prince Henry was awaiting his coming. The prince stepped forward and greeted the president most cordially and there was an interchange of amenities. 
