HOUSE PASSES POSTAL BILL

Incorporates Provision Classifying the Rural Free Delivery Service. HAYD DRESSES LETTER TO THE HOUSE

WASHINGTON, March 14.—The house today passed the postage appropriation bill. The only amendment of importance adopted was one to incorporate in the bill the provisions of the bill to classify the rural free delivery service, passed a few days ago.

Quite a number of other bills were passed including three bills for marine hospitals at Buffalo, Savannah and Pittsburg. The Burlington resolution calling on the secretary of state for the facts relative to the case of Dr. Thomas and his wife, who desired to go to South Africa to distribute relief funds, was adopted after a short debate.

Large Budget of Bills. A resolution was adopted to authorize the secretary of war to loan tents to the Texas Confederate Reunion association, which meets at Dallas April 22.

Brings Up Passport Case. Mr. Burleson of Texas got the floor and renewed the case of Rev. Hiram Thomas and wife, whose application to the state department for a request to the British authorities for passports to enter the Boer lines in South Africa for the purpose of distributing relief funds was brought to the attention of the house by him a few days ago.

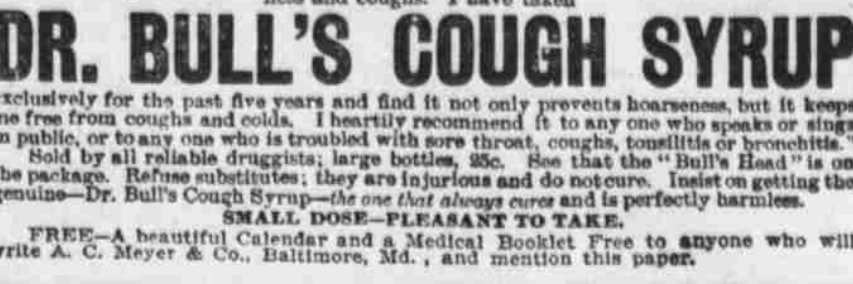
