PEACE AT HAND IN SAMAR

Surrender of Insurgents Will Take Place Within One Week.

CORDIAL RECEPTION OF GENERAL SMITH

Philippines Are Courteous and State Their Grievances, Which, When Met, Give Way to Pledges of Peace.

ABE FRANK WINS THE DERBY

Hanover Colt Captures the Race, Leading Lon Woods by a Neck.

MEMPHIS, Tenn., April 9.—The Tennessee Derby, at a mile and an eighth, valued at about \$5,000, was won today by George C. Bennett's Hanover, a bay colt, owned by George W. Mason, 712 North Twenty-fourth street, in offering some special bargain in choice vacant and improved property. Any one intending to buy for a home or investment will do well to see him.

MANILA, April 9.—General Jacob Smith, commanding the American forces in Samar, gives an interesting description of his conference on the Candara river, in Samar, with the insurgent leader, Guevarra, who is to surrender to the American authorities.

Conditions of Surrender.

First—That the friars be expelled from the Philippines.

Second—Freedom of worship.

Third—The expulsion of all Chinese merchants.

Fourth—The establishment of a school system.

Fifth—Liberty of the press.

Sixth—The release of all prisoners of war.

General Smith informed Guevarra that when peace was assured the prisoners of war undoubtedly would be released.

He said that a school system was already in operation in the pacified districts of the archipelago and that this system would be extended to Samar island.

He explained that the entrance of Chinese to the Philippine islands was prohibited by law and it would be unfair to expel those now engaged in business under the flag.

He said that all persons in the archipelago were entitled to citizenship as they pleased and that the press was now free.

When they accepted peace, he explained, they would have government and a greater degree of liberty. Guevarra and his party accepted these explanations and promised to surrender April 15.

He then escorted the American officers to a banquet, which was served with cold napkins and additional adjuncts of civilization. The insurgent general apologized for the scarcity of food. The principal dishes at the banquet were chickens and the meat of the water buffalo.
