The city clerk has been directed to prepare subpoenas summoning the officers to appear next Wednesday and bring their books.

He said: "We are waiting to see what shape the order will come to us in, and then, if everything is regular, we shall, of course, obey the order of the court. We are already assessed at our full valuation. I don't see what the city hopes to gain by bringing our books into court. Then there's another side of the question: If the five public service corporations are assessed too low, about a hundred or other concerns, public and private, of which the same may be said with equal truth? Where is it going to stop? This is a broader question than appears at first glance."
